

**SHAMROCK TOWNSHIP
RE-ORG/REGULAR BOARD MEETING CONTINUED
Thursday March 29, 2022**

Board Chairman Ron Smith called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. and led the Pledge of Allegiance. Present were Supervisors Allen Eld and Charles Quale; Treasurer John Brula; Clerk Candace Kral and one resident.

OLD BUSINESS:

Shamrock Recreation Area Project – The board was also presented with a new Romtec project proposal for the bathrooms/pavilion with the changes for the previous meeting for their review. It was brought to the board’s attention that individuals within the community are showing disappointment in the fact that there are no local bid options. The board was pleased with the current design. The pricing of the project does cause concern, as it appears to be much higher than necessary, than what it could be built for. The board discussed the specifics of the building together with the cost. The board also stated they would rather have a set of plans available for local contractors to bid this project. Motion made by Ron Smith, seconded by Allen Eld, to grant Charles Quale the authority to approve and sign final documentations of the bathrooms/pavilion structure to enable the township to move forward with the project; motion passed unanimously. Upon further discussion of the cost of the project, the board agreed to talk with other contractors to obtain professional opinions and options. The board tabled this the park project to continue this meeting until March 29, 7:00 pm.

The board discussed options relating to the bidding and construction of the tennis/pickleball courts.

NEW BUSINESS

The board reviewed the condition use permit request by Abraham Davis, 46873 189th Place to operate an automotive service, repair and sales facility. The Board has no concerns or objections to the requested permit and recommends that all county rules and regulations be followed.
